11) BENEFICIARIES PROFILE:

a) **Description:**

Jivhalla Assumption Social Centre (JASC) is working with the adivasis and Dalits from the year 2006 onwards. We experience the heartbeat of each of them and feel with them and feel one among them in all what they are. We are part and parcel of their life. We are very much aware of their socio-psychological, educational, and economic needs. We have a strong bond between the people with whom we are working.

Migration of the poor and adhivasi are going on and growing in this area. And JASC has to reach and make available it's services to other areas and other groups of people for the sustainable development. We hope to bring more of this marginalized section of the society under the wing of Jivhalla Assumption Social Centre and gradually bring them to the main streams of society.

The adivasi community is a migrant community. They are deprived of the government schemes due to lack of proper documents like Voter Identification Card, Ration Card, Adar Card, school leaving certificate etc. According to the government records these people do not exist. This affects them socially, economically, educationally and politically. The recent political scenario of the country worsens the situation of the poor of this area. They need the intervention from JASC at all levels.

During the project implementation of the previous project we realize that women need to voice out to get their rights. We became aware that they are not given proper wages for the work done by them in the agricultural field and also as domestic workers. The violence against women and children are a fact even today though there is some changes in some areas because of JASC, these needs to be continuously addressed personally and as a group.

The digitalized world of today, the adivasi community is unfamiliar with computer and communication media and the new ways of dealing with bank and other systems of society. The children and youth needs to be empowered to make their life fit into the new systems of life and use it in a healthy way. Many children and youth are lost and are in the point of suicide because they want everything happen now, cannot wait or cannot adjust or find an alternative. Parents are not able to understand and answer to the real needs of children and youth. They are also addicted to the new IT system and many are also addicted to alcoholism, drugs and other vices. Relationships in the family have become for namesake and bond between parents and children

are lost. Thus, recently there are a few youth who committed suicide in Vasai and we feel the need to guide and counsel, along with educating and empowering them. They need to be supported and guided in the proper direction which will enhance their life.

The schools in this area provide education but it is not enough for the students to study well, they need to go for tuition. But the poor students cannot afford the tuition fee, thus we need to support such poor and marginalized children for their education and value based empowerment at all levels (all-round development). Some of the children drop out of school. These groups also need to be attended. The Various educational camps, celebrations and other activities are JASC's attempt to build them up.

If a woman is educated a family will be educated and if family is educated, then a society will be educated. A mother is the light of the family and she is the first and best of the teachers. Thus we need to empower the women of the poor sections so that she can be a real mother and teacher to these children. Women are also a great medium for social change and she is very good in saving money and saving life. Thus, JASC continue our effort to create and build new Self Help Groups as well as sustaining the already existing ones.

We realized that having training in tailoring or other courses here in the Jivhalla Centre is not enough as JASC is involved with different SHG groups and women in faraway villages,. Thus; we envisage conducting mobile Beautician Course, Mobile Cutting and Tailoring Centre and other skill development according to the demand of the women. Instead of women coming to us, we are launching out our services to them in their own areas. Though it may cost a little more of finance and more hard work from the center's part, more women will benefit from the service rendered to them.

We are wonderstruck by the growing number of cancer deaths in Vasia. The number of people especially women who are affected are great in number. Since this sickness cost lot of money for treatment as well as need healthy food, many of the poor cannot afford. This makes them depressed, frightened, hopeless, withdrawn, helpless and lonely; thus leading some of them to commit suicide. Thus, we plan to start an Onco-Care unit hoping to be a light, hope, joy and support to them; being a life-promoting agent.

Another innovative way to teach the students is by collaborating with Zilla Parsihad (Government) Schools of this area. The audio visual library and mobile computer education programme will reach out to government school children.
