## Highlights of activities – NOVEMBER 2017

The distinct activities this month were the Orientation Visits to a range of Government Offices, the Internship placement in Nursery Schools and Hospitals/Clinics, as also an experience in marketing skills in the local market.

The three months internship for the Nursing Assistant student began on November 1 and will continue until January 30, 2018. Three hospitals/clinics gladly welcomed our students to enable them have a valuable experience in caring for the sick in a hospital setting. Renuka hospital, Ambey Clinic, and Primary Health Centre which is a Government hospital.

November 9. One group of students visited Government offices in Talasari Talukas. They visited the Police Station, the Local Government offices, the I.C.D.S. office the Electricity Board. They were given a detailed explanation of the functioning of the varied services, Government program which they could exploit for their future development. They were informed of the ways and means of addressing their grievances and demanding essential services.

The second group had their orientation visit on <u>November</u> <u>22</u> to Dahanu Talukas. In addition to the Government offices, this group consisting of our nursing Assistants made a trip to a large Government hospital to witness its functioning.

## November 12-19.

Six of our students were taken to Mumbai for Social Work development training. The session included Communication skills, Socio-development problems, Issues on Health, Street play techniques, Human Rights, Functioning of Government programs and exploiting them, skills in organizing and mobilizing the village community to address grievances etc.

## November 8 and 29

These two days were set aside for the students to exercise their marketing skills. Garments tailored by them were taken to the market for sale- they had a chance to attract customers, convince them by their sale talks and eventually sell off some of the tailored garments.

November 20-30 saw the Nursery training students placed in four different Government Nursery schools for learning – teaching experience guided and supervised by the staff of the school. It was a fun-filled experience for them making teaching aids, engaging the kids in activities like reading, writing, picture-talk, action songs and dance.
