BSA'S CHILDREN'S REMOTE MICRO LIBRARY PROGRAMME

On the occasion of International Children's Book Day, April 2, 2019, BSA's Children's Remote Micro Library was inaugurated. The representatives from 17 different Children's Club were in attendance. The value of books was discussed and children were encouraged to develop a love for books and the habit of reading which helps them to improve their vocabulary, to use words correctly and appropriately, to be able to express their feelings through language. There is limited or no access to books and reading materials for the children living in the rural villages in the district of Kalimpong.



Children's Remote Micro Library provides and promotes quality reading materials to develop and inculcate in children the habit of reading to enrich their intellectual, aesthetic, cultural and emotional growth. The library is managed and maintained by Children's Club at their respective villages and BSA Team drives to different villages to shuffle the selection of books in the library.

During the month of April, as per the planning, the Child Protection Workers (CPWs) conducted ten school sessions (Kalimpong:06/ Siliguri:03 /Bundapani GP: 01) on POCSO covering 285 Students in Kalimpong, Siliguri and Bundapani GP respectively. The main objectives of these sessions were to learn to recognise and identify abuse as well as to prevent oneself from any type of abuses in the school, in the family and society at large and thus creating child friendly environment.

EARTH DAY OBSERVATION





CPWs along with the community-based committees (VCs), observed the Earth Day on 22nd April 2019 in Kalimpong, Siliguri and Bundapani GP. Awareness sessions with the students and children's club members on the protection of earth was conducted by child protection workers. The objective of these programs was:

- To Educate and raise awareness about the accelerating rate of extinction of millions of species and the causes and consequences of this phenomenon.
- Encourage individual actions such as adopting plant-based diet and stopping pesticide and herbicide use.

The Child Protection Workers of each gram panchayats took the initiative to make the programs more effective and useful for the children and the people in the community. In Kalimpong, the awareness session was conducted in Chandramaya High School followed by cleaning up of the compound. In order to save the earth, Miss Ruth Mukhia, one of the Children's Club members

herself prepared banner with charts. In Birpara, an awareness session with the students followed by street play on protection of earth by the Children's club members of Bundapani Gram Panchayats was conducted. In Siliguri Municipality, the Child Protection Workers along with the Children Club members conducted plantation of trees, awareness session on saving environment by Child Protection Workers and conducted rally by the children club members. Total 285 children were the participants during this program in these three working areas.

FOURTH TIME SHARING OF CATS PROGRAM

The Child Protection Worker along with two participants of CATS program carried out the tasks of sharing points discussed in the conference of Pune. The team shared that each child is responsible for creating and promoting a dream village/ dream society, a best place wherein all children's well-being, safety and rights are protected. The team also talked on the topic of "Counter Culture". The cultures which are not in our favour have to be countered. The evil practices that exists in our society in the name of caste, religion etc. impede for the holistic



development of the children in our society. During the sharing, the children participants shared good & bad practices existing in their society and how they are affected. The sharing was conducted with the children in Sindebong, Pudung, Bong Busty & BSA's Children's Home. Total 100 children were part of this sharing.

EXPOSURE VISIT TO BSA BY THE TEAM WORKING FOR COMBATTING HUMAN TRAFFICKING IN ASSAM & ARUNACHAL PRADESH

North East Caritas India Team along with its five partners made their exposure visit to Bal Suraksha Abhiyan Trust (BSA), From 9th to 11th May 2019. The team consisted of nineteen members. They visited all the targeted gram panchayats and met children's club and ICDS centres under working areas of Bal Suraksha Abhiyan Trust (BSA). On the first day the group was given orientation on Child Rights about the organisation and the works being carried out in the districts of Kalimpong, Darjeeling and Alipurduar. On the following day, the team members were divided into two groups and were taken to Pudung, Sindebong and Teesta Bazar.





The members met vigilance committees and children's clubs in the respective areas. The members were enriched by the sharing of the committees and children clubs in protecting child rights in the community level. Meeting with the local Gram Panchayats Members and School Heads in the community, the team learned the spirit of collaboration and networking in establishing a child friendly community. ORIENTATION ON CHILD RIGHTS

On 22nd May 2019, the Child Protection Workers of Bundapani Gram Panchayat conducted an orientation program on Child Rights and Protection to the gram panchayat members and the community people of Mujnai Tea Garden under Madharihat GP & Block. The main purpose of the program was to orient on Child Rights and Protection. There were twenty members present in the program. The outcome of the program was Rapport building with the community people and



one missing case related to a minor girl child was also discussed by the community people during the discussion and intervened immediately by the Child Protection Worker of Bundapani GP. The gained the knowledge about the organization and Child Rights program in Bundapani GP. The community people resolved to contact the Child Protection Workers for further orientation on Child Rights in the community.

PLANNING & REVIEW MEETING

From 28th to 29th May 2019, eight partners of Caritas India under West Bengal had the planning and review meeting of the new project. The title of the project was "United for Child Protection - Protecting and Reclaiming Childhood in West Bengal". During these two days, the partners were made aware on the changes that had been brought by the donor in the project. The outcome and the outputs of the project was also explained in detail. The state finance officer in the second half of the meeting explained about




the budget and the bills along with the report of each activity. The thematic officer from HoD, Ms. Lee shared about the Child Protection Policy of Caritas India and informed all the partners to share about the policy with the staff working under Caritas project. The action plan/DIP for next three months were explained to all the partners. Each partner decided to send it back to the zonal officer after reworking on it. West Bengal partners under Caritas India would be working under the umbrella of Caritas India on Child Rights. The old partners of Child Rights decided to accompany the new partners on implementing the project in the new areas.

MEETING WITH SCHOOL TEACHERS

The Child Protection Worker along with the school head & teachers of one of the government high school at Sindebong GP had the meeting regarding the enrolment of drop out children and Cases related to POCSO. Through this meeting, two drop out children were enrolled back to school




VISIT FROM AMTM FRANCE, 2019
