After some input there were group discussions and the women were asked to prepare a report of their group discussion. While some sang panchayat raj



songs, other read out their report of their discussion. Their insights and the problems they mentioned made one wonder how they still had the will to still go ahead and set things

they should be. The legally women went home determined to see that in their wadis, the panchayat raj institutions would run as they should and the defaulters should be brought to book.



WOMEN AND LAW
