We want to thank Fede for the opportunity to introducing us to India, his beloved India. What made Fede love India was his people, all of you and the many ones that have not been able to come today but are here in spirit.

From a distant land, we have learnt, through Fede, about his Indian families, you, his Jesuits colleagues, about his beginnings in Kurseong, his life at Achanak Colony, the Holy Family Parish, his adventure at Raigad district, Vinayalaya and about the many friends and parishioners in all these places.

He was a clear example of how to live with the poorest and most deprived ones and we've learnt from him to love the adivasis.

The Sopena family wants to thank his very large Indian family for these great years with him.

It is only through Fede's action that we are able to understand better thereal meaning of the word thanks.

We feel grateful that his latest dream came through - becoming an Indian citizen, just 8 months ago, and to die and being buried in Indian soil. What a great day, Republic Day, to have the dream fulfilled.
